Session No 1: June 28, 2006

Introduction to the Course and Greetings.

Vocabulary: Greetings (Saludos y expresiones de cortesía). Spelling names and Last names.

Grammar: Alphabet, spelling, how to form a question and Gender/Plural

Cultural and Historical Aspects: Ancient, civilizations in Latin America, Colonial Period and Independence.

Session No 2: July 5th, 2006.

Dealing with Numbers and Money.

Vocabulary: Numbers, telling the time, weather expressions, date, days of the week, months and colors. Money, math expressions and expressions with “tener”

Grammar: Pronouns, verbs (ser, estar, ser de) and “Hace” (for weather expressions. Verbs : tener, ir, dar, gustar and ¿Cuánto es?

Cultural and Historical Aspects: MAP of Latin America, regions, weather, characteristics of population and Spanish: regional differences. Currency, tips and bargaining.

Session No 3: July 12, 2006.

At the Hotel and Transportation

Vocabulary: The hotel, how to register, the bank, post office and telephone. Learning how to talk about the family and work, taking a cab or metro and receiving directions “derecha, izquierda, etc).

Grammar: Place prepositions. Regular verbs :to take, to buy, deposit, to sell. More verbs and expressions. Expressions with “hay” . Where?

Cultural and Historical Aspects: Doing business protocol. In the City, museums and main attractions.

Session No 4: July 19, 2006.

At the Restaurant

Vocabulary: Restaurant, meals, the bill, the tip and how to order.

Grammar: Verbs: Comer, pagar, gustar, servir, pedir, conseguir and decir. Saber/conocer.

Cultural and Historical Aspects: Food : A cultural experience. Typical foods.

Session No 5: July 26, 2006.

At the Doctors – Pharmacy, Oral Practice / Interaction

Vocabulary: at the hospital, at the doctor, at the pharmacy, your medicines, symptoms and parts of the body. Interacting with people in a Spanish speaking country. Exercises and Situations.

Grammar: Verbs: “Doler” and other expressions. Meeting someone/general situations. Review: Dealing with particular situations.

Cultural and Historical Aspects: How to ask for a doctor, Important tips, general information on cultural aspects and main artists and writers of Latin America.

GRADUATION: An accreditation (Certificate) will be provided for each of the participants.

To learn another’s language is the greatest of compliments. The warmth, appreciation and welcome you will receive is incomparable. Nothing bespeaks your interest and concern more than taking the time to learn someone’s language.

There is something more important than just learning the basic phrases when traveling in Spanish-speaking lands though, and that is learning some **fundamentals** about the culture of a country before you visit it.
